

10:05 - 10:40am	Round 1 Jr. Game competition begins on. Teams compete in a pre-determined order set by the site host. Each round will be 7 minutes on average in length, which includes:  Move-in (2 min), Team introductions (max 1 min), Play (2 min), and Move-out and return robot to holding area (2 min).  With 5 Game teams, there will be five Round 1 competitions for a time of 5 x 7 = 35 minutes; Game 10 minute break.
